September is National Suicide Prevention Awareness Month.

In ages 10 – 14, we have seen an alarming increase in suicides. The number of suicides for this group has more than doubled since 2006. More teenagers and young adults die from suicide than from cancer, heart disease, AIDS, birth defects, stroke, pneumonia, influenza, and chronic lung disease, **combined**. Over-all, suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for our youth ages 10-24. Each day in our nation, there are an average of over 3,703 attempts by young people grades 9-12.

Four out of **Five** teens who attempt suicide have given clear warning signs.

Recognizing these signs can help prevent suicide:

- Suicide Threats
- Depression
- · Anger, Increased Irritability
- · Lack of Interest
- · Sudden increase/decrease in appetite
- · Sudden changes in appearance
- · Dwindling academic performance
- · Preoccupation with death and suicide
- · Previous suicide attempts
- · Final arrangements
- Signs of self harm
